
This letter is being submitted to the Australian Securities Exchange as an accompaniment to the company's Appendix 5B Statement of Cash Flows for the quarter ended 30th September 2013.

An adjustment has been made to Section 4 of the Appendix 5B – “Estimated cash outflow for the next quarter” to clarify the funding of exploration expenditure for the next quarter.

During the September quarter Global Geoscience (“Global”) has undertaken exploration on behalf of its partners Osisko Mining Corporation and Antofagasta plc. Global pays all exploration and related expenditure on behalf of the partnerships and recovers the funds either during the quarter in which they are incurred or during the following quarter.

This can result in Global understating its cash position at the end of a quarter. At the end of the September quarter, Global was entitled to payments of approximately US\$330,000 from its exploration partners.

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
